Our School Day




- All children will be welcomed into school at 8:30 from the Key Stage 2 playground and collected at 8:40

The Stanford Way



- This year, we are following a behaviour curriculum to ensure all children meet their true potential.
- We will be focusing on being respectful, responsible and ready to learn.
- Discussing ways to address others when talking to them, to include manners and making eye contact.
- Ensuring we present our work to the best standard.

Rewards and Behaviour



- Each day, we will be working on a new value and children who demonstrate this will be added to our 'recognition board' and this is then recognised during our collective worship.
- Other rewards include, receiving team points for good behaviour, effort and good work, Star of the Week, Star Writer, Reading certificates (certificate for completing a double page and a prize for completing 5 double pages), Star Spellers, Value Ambassador and Believe and Achieve (once a term).
- Occasionally, children need support with making the right choices.

Homework



- Weekly spellings
- Numbots (3 minutes a day)
- Daily reading (5 minutes a day) please write in your child's reading diary every time they read
- 1 long term project (this will be after half term)
- Maths this will either be via Purple Mash or in homework books

Homework books will be sent home weekly and should be returned every Monday

Reading



- Reading is such a fundamental skill to aid all other learning and we will aim to hear all children read weekly. We will also focus on learning new vocabulary and showing a deeper understanding by answering inference and retrieval questions.
- Any reading completed in school will be recorded in Reading Diaries.
- To support our learning at school, we ask for children to read as often as possible at home (5 minutes). Please record in your child's diaries each time they have read.
- Books will be changed weekly.
- WE NEED YOU please let us know if you able to spare any time to come into school to hear readers.

Assessments in Year 1



- Throughout the year, children will complete a range of assessments, including:
- End of topic maths assessment
- Reading comprehension and Grammar assessment
- Common Exception Words spelling and reading
- Alongside this, we will be completing 'teacher assessments' within foundation subjects.
- All data will be used to determine if children are;
- Working towards KS1 expectations
- Working at KS1 expectations
- Working above KS1 expectations
- In the summer term, children will complete a national phonics assessment. More to come on this!
