Homework

There will be 3 parts to homework:

1. Maths & Grammar worksheets/games/investigations based on what we are learning in class.

2. Spelling for test on a Tuesday.

3. Topic based homework project - a WW2 themed project to be competed by half term. Followed by a Book themed Christmas decoration to be completed before Christmas

- Reading your child should still be reading to you at least once per week, and reading independently every day.
- Homework will come home on a Thursday, to be returned by the following Tuesday.
- After Christmas, the format for Homework will change in preparation for SATs.





- Will take place during the week beginning
 13th May 2024
- 1 grammar paper, 1 spelling paper, 1 reading paper, 3 maths papers.
- After Christmas we will start working on test technique and we will send home practice papers.
- You will receive more information at Parents Evening in February





- SAT papers are marked by external examiners
- We get the results back just before the end of the summer term and the result will be sent home with the end of year reports
- The format of results is:

Your child <u>has met</u> the expected standard

or

Your child <u>has not met</u> the expected standard





Writing is not assessed in a test format.

- It is assessed in class, over the year, against a set of national criteria.
- We will teach the children what the criteria mean and how to use them in their writing.
- They are then given a result of:
- Working At The Standard
- Working Below The Standard
- Working Above The Standard

Teachers judgements are externally moderated.





You will receive mini reports on your child's progress in December and March/April.

These will be based on Teacher Assessments and will say Met/Almost/Target against the year group objectives
