Staff join in with the children, which they love and they can follow video clips on the interactive white board.</p> <p>Year 2 and 6 have had 10 sessions of swimming.</p> <p>Since the 2017 to 2018 academic year, there is a new condition requiring schools to publish how many pupils within their year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. 2 out of our 27 Year 6 children have not currently met the requirement - will look into Top Up sessions in the Summer Term.</p> <p>Safety surface is in place and is much safer for the children to use while on the trim trail.</p>

All children were engaged and the performances were excellent.'</i></p> <p>7 year 4, 4 Year 5 and 2 Year 6 children have attended 5 weeks of top up swim sessions. The year 4 and 5 children were chosen to help them towards achieving the 25m independent swim that they need to achieve before the end of year 6. The 2 year 6 children both achieved the 25m.</p> <p>The children enjoyed the sessions and had good fun, half the class went at a time so the smaller class sizes helped with allowing the children to change and the amount of support they received in the water.</p> <p>Total £1280</p> <p>The Year 6 children took part in a mental health workshop lead by professional staff. Through story, discussion and craft activities, they were encouraged to think about what mental health is, the problems they might encounter as they grow up and how to deal with their worries in a positive way.
