Year 2 and 6 have had 10 sessions of swimming.

2 out of our 27 Year 6 children have not currently met the swimming requirement - By the end of year 6 each pupil is required to be able to do the following:

- -Perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations
- -Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- -Use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.

We have begun to embed the Jigsaw Approach to teach our PSHE, as it brings together Personal, Social, Health, Sex and Relationships Education, emotional literacy, social skills, moral and spiritual development in an age appropriate, progressive scheme. The whole school has worked on the same theme (puzzle) at the same time, generating a whole school focus for adults and children alike. Children have enjoyed the new approach and have asked appropriate questions with maturity.

Term 3 and 4

Premier sport an afternoon for 10 weeks, teaching 2 classes Years 2 and 6 (including after school club) Year 2 had team teach Gymnastic sessions. FWK observed one of the team teach lessons as part of a PE Deep Dive. All children were building on prior knowledge taught. Teacher was using the correct terminology and asking appropriate questions about balances

Year 6 had team teach Basketball sessions. FWK observed one of the team teach lessons as part of a PE Deep Dive. All children were building on previous skills that had been taught. Teacher and children were using correct terminology. Children were encouraged to explain ways to improve or change tactics within their games. Game techniques were being taught and children could identify how the skills they had been taught were transferrable to the games they were playing.

Hockey after school club

Term 2 - Total for premier sports - £1453.80

Both classes received 9/10 of their planned lessons due to the school closure.

Hockey club ran for KS2 children - partnership hockey competition was in March. The children did exceptionally well and enjoyed using the skills taught against other school teams.

Subsidise some swimming costs for Years 1 and 3 at Faringdon Leisure Centre - cost of £1600.

Year 1 and 3 went swimming. Year 3 completed all 10 swimming lessons, however due to school closure (Covid 19) Year 1 only had 8 sessions. 2 sessions have been reimbursed to parents. No refund received from pool as yet.

Taking part in partnership competitions.

Dance festival - a Lion King workshop run by KAs children. The children learnt a routine as well as choreographed their own routine.

Year 5 and 6 sportshall athletics - children performed brilliantly and supported each other. They came second overall only 4 points behind the winners!

Year 5 and 6 Hockey, this was a new experience for all the children playing on a full size hockey pitch and on Astro Turf. The improvement they made over their 4 games was incredible and they all showed resilience and determination.

Year 5 and 6 Netball Tournament. The team won their league, without conceding a goal! They then went on to with the entire tournament only conceding 4 goals in total!

The children then discussed ways to improve/change their courses and negotiated with peers the best way possible.


