## **Parking Complaint**

I had an email from a concerned and upset parent about unsafe parking.

'I wanted to bring to your attention some illegal parking by parents of children at the school along High Street. Frequently I have observed cars and vans parked directly on the zig zag lines adjacent to the pedestrian crossing that is opposite the Co-Op. These cars and vans belong to parents of the school as I have seen the drivers return to their vehicles along with their children once collected from school.

Today however there were three vehicles (two cars and a van) parked on the zigzag lines adjacent to the pedestrian crossing.
